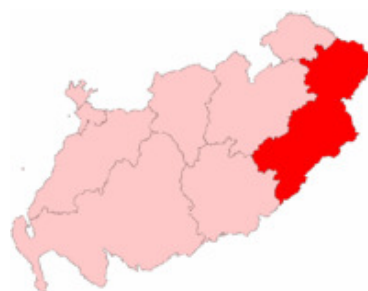

## Roxburgh & Berwickshire<sup>1</sup> Smoking Statistics

### In your area

Within the NHS Borders smoking prevalence is highest in the 16-24 and 25-34 age groups and drops progressively in older age groups<sup>2</sup>.

In NHS Borders a Tobacco Strategy was approved by the Health Board in May 2006<sup>5</sup>.

Within the NHS Borders area a whole school approach linking with Health Promoting Schools has been developed and is expected to cover all schools by 2010, this will include curriculum development, staff awareness and training, and the school smoking policy<sup>5</sup>.

A pilot project for pregnant smokers based on West Lothian's 'Stop for Life' programme is taking place in areas of deprivation within Hawick, North Galashiels and Stow<sup>5</sup>.

### National View

It is estimated that 24% (13,500 deaths) of all deaths in Scotland in 2004 were attributable to smoking with 89.5% of all lung cancer deaths attributable to smoking. Amongst those in middle age (35-69) an average of 22 years of life are lost per death from smoking<sup>2</sup>.

In 2003/04 it is estimated that there were approximately 1.1 million adult smokers in Scotland, 27.2% of the adult population<sup>2</sup>.
